At 6:33 P.M., Mayor Steve Brewer gave the invocation. After the invocation, Mayor Brewer led everyone present in reciting the Pledge of Allegiance to the Flag of the United States of America. He then declared that a quorum of the City Commission was present and called the meeting to order.

REVIEW AND TAKE ACTION TO APPROVE MINUTES OF PROCEEDINGS OF THE REGULAR MEETING OF THE CITY COMMISSION HELD ON TUESDAY, APRIL 24, 2012

After review of the minutes, Commissioner Lori Weaver moved to approve the minutes of proceedings of the regular meeting of the City Commission held on Tuesday, April 24, 2012. Commissioner Angelica P. Baldivia seconded the motion, and the motion carried by unanimous vote of the City Commissioners present.

REPORTS BY TXDOT STAFF ON LA FERIA RELATED PROJECTS AND **DISCUSSION WITH THE CITY COMMISSION**

Mr. Juan A. Bernal, P.E., CFM, Transportation Engineer from the Pharr TxDOT office, presented a map of the sidewalks to be built through the Safe Routes to School Project. He said the plans have been submitted to Austin, and the State expects a September

letting of the project with construction starting some time in November. Once construction starts, it may take up to six months to complete. The total funding of the project is \$500,000.00. Commissioner Angelica P. Baldivia inquired about sidewalks at the corner of Canal and Jessamine. She said the last two houses on the south side of the street pose a hazard to the children crossing. Mayor Brewer inquired about sidewalks to the new Sam Houston Elementary. Ms. Irene Szedlmayer replied that neither Sam Houston nor Sanchez Elementary would have sidewalks. City Manager Sunny K. Philip explained that based on the map, the sidewalks are already planned to the end of the street on Jessamine to Canal.

Mr. Bernal also reported that the other project is the hot mix overlay on FM 506 from Business 83 to Expressway 83. The letting is also in September, but construction may not start until sometime in January 2013. Mayor Brewer thanked Mr. Bernal for his presentation.

PRESENTATION, AND DISCUSSION WITH THE CITY COMMISSION, BY THE CAMERON COUNTY DEPARTMENT OF HEALTH AND HUMAN SERVICES REGARDING THE 1115 MEDICAID WAIVER AND THE POSSIBLE IMPACT ON THE LA FERIA COMMUNITY

Ms. Yvette Salinas from the Cameron County Department of Health and Human Services was present to discuss this item. She presented a PowerPoint presentation on the topic and said this is a five-year project that is now in year one. In 1985, Cameron County had an Indigent Healthcare Program. This was changed in 2007, and then again in 2011. The State now requires a managed care system. There are various conditions that have to be met and right now the County is working on trying to develop a regional plan. The state is now looking for healthier communities and the 1115 Waiver provides incentive payments for health care improvements. Ms. Salinas said they are on a very short time frame, and were hoping that the City Commission would commit something. Mayor Brewer said that, basically, there is a 30% or 35% match on the City's part for any project that is proposed. City Manager Sunny K. Philip said that staff would review the guidelines and try to bring back a resolution at a later date. Mayor Brewer thanked Ms. Salinas for her presentation.

PRESENTATION AND DISCUSSION WITH THE CITY COMMISSION ON SPACEX BY BROWNSVILLE ECONOMIC DEVELOPMENT COUNCIL

Mr. Jason Hilts, President and CEO of the Brownsville Economic Development Council, was present to discuss this item. This is a project that would establish a rocket launch site that would be launching rockets into space. Brownsville is very attractive for this project because of its southernmost location in the U.S. The site would be in Boca Chica Beach. It would not restrict access to Boca Chica Beach. SpaceX is a private company and was founded by Elon Musk, one of the cofounders of Paypal. They are based out of California. Brownsville is in competition with Florida and Puerto Rico. Mr. Hilts said the purpose of his presentation is to bring awareness to the communities and to garner support from the communities for the project. Mayor Brewer thanked Mr. Hilts for his presentation.

CONSIDER AND TAKE ACTION TO APPROVE OR DENY RESOLUTION OF THE CITY OF LA FERIA IN SUPPORT OF SPACEX.

City Manager Sunny K. Philip said that the City has always partnered with other communities for regional projects and staff is recommending approval. He said the

message we are sending is that we are 100% behind the project. Commissioner Angelica P. Baldivia moved to read the resolution by caption only, in lieu of reading it in its entirety. Commissioner John Hernandez seconded the motion, and the motion carried by unanimous vote of the City Commissioners present. City Attorney Mr. Richard S. Talbert read the caption of Resolution 2012-25. After reading of the caption, Commissioner John Hernandez moved to approve Resolution 2012-25 in support of SpaceX. Commissioner Angelica P. Baldivia seconded the motion, and the motion carried by unanimous vote of the City Commissioners present.

PROCLAMATION PROCLAIMING MAY 20-26, 2012 AS "NATIONAL PUBLIC WORKS WEEK"

City Manager Sunny K. Philip said Commissioner Victor Gonzalez, Jr. brought to our attention that May 20-26 would be "National Public Works Week" and that the City is fortunate to have good employees. He introduced Public Works Director Mr. Javier Martinez who introduced all of the employees in his department. Mayor Steve Brewer said that they are very good employees and they make public officials look good. Commissioner Gonzalez and the other Commissioners said they are very proud of the employees. Commissioner John Hernandez made his comments in Spanish for those employees who may not be bilingual. Commissioner Angelica P. Baldivia moved to approve the Proclamation proclaiming May 20-26, 2012 as "National Public Works Week." Commissioner Lori Weaver seconded the motion, and the motion carried by unanimous vote of the City Commissioners present. City Manager Sunny K. Philip also recognized Police Lieutenant Adolfo Luna and Building Inspector Armando Prado who also do an excellent job for the City and were present at this meeting. All employees received a round of applause.

Mayor Steve Brewer declared the meeting in executive (closed) session at 7:14 P.M. After executive session deliberation, Mayor Steve Brewer declared the meeting back in open session at 8:06 P.M.

City Manager Sunny K. Philip stated that all the documents for this item would be filed with the City Secretary. Mr. Philip inquired of the public if there were any owners in the audience who were here representing any of the properties. There were no owners in the audience. Mayor Steve Brewer declared the public hearing open at 8:12 P.M. Planning and Community Development Director Ms. Irene Szedlmayer presented a PowerPoint presentation of all the above mentioned properties with photos of conditions, describing each item separately. Ms. Szedlmayer said all notification procedures were followed and pictures and copies of all inspection reports were included in the Commission's packets. There were no comments received on Items A, B, or C. The property listed as Item C still has electricity provided and Mr. Philip said that the reason for that is that the son of the owner had been living there. Building Inspector Armando Prado said several months ago, there was evidence that he was living there, but last month there was no evidence that he is still residing there. Mr. Philip said there had been other efforts to try to relocate him to other living quarters, but they were unsuccessful. Ms. Maria Murillo and Ms. Luisa Serna were present to speak on the conditions of Items D and E. Their comments were that there are people hiding in those homes and there are rats in the area. Item F was a success story. When the owner was notified, he moved quickly to make repairs. There being no further comments, Mayor Steve Brewer declared the public hearing closed at 8:35 P.M.

City Manager Sunny K. Philip reported that last year was the first year that the City applied for funding under this grant and a grant was received in the amount of \$5,000.00. This year the City learned of the funding earlier and Finance Director Ms. Maria S. Chavero has prepared an application. This grant is for overtime for Police Officers and also for mileage reimbursement. Mr. Philip said there are certain specific conditions with this grant, and staff will be working with the Police Department to meet these conditions. Commissioner Lori Weaver moved to read the resolution by caption only, in lieu of reading it in its entirety. Commissioner Angelica P. Baldivia seconded the motion, and the motion carried by unanimous vote of the City Commissioners present. City Attorney Mr. Richard S. Talbert read the caption of Resolution 2012-26. After reading of the caption, Commissioner Lori Weaver moved to approve Resolution 2012-26 authorizing the submission of an application for grant funding to the Texas Department of Public Safety through the Texas Ranger Division for the Local Border Security Program (LBSP) and designating officials to execute an interlocal cooperative agreement and other necessary documents between the City of La Feria and the Texas Department of Transportation for the LBSP. Commissioner Victor Gonzalez, Jr. seconded the motion, and the motion carried by unanimous vote of the City Commissioners present.

Commissioner John Hernandez seconded the motion, and the motion carried by unanimous vote of the City Commissioners present.
