The purpose of said meeting was to consider and take action on those items of Utilities Board business as was duly posted by agenda in accordance with the State Open Meetings Law. There were no other persons in attendance at this meeting.

At 5:18 P.M., Board Chairman Mr. Adolfo Lopez asked all present to rise and recite aloud the Pledge of Allegiance to the Flag of the United States of America. After this was done, Mr. Lopez declared that a quorum of the Board was present and called the meeting to order.

REVIEW AND TAKE ACTION TO APPROVE MINUTES OF PROCEEDINGS OF THE REGULAR MEETING OF THE LA FERIA UTILITIES BOARD HELD ON TUESDAY, MAY 8, 2012

After review of the minutes, Mr. Ralph Muse moved to approve the minutes of proceedings of the regular meeting of the La Feria Utilities Board held on Tuesday, May 8, 2012 as presented in written form. Ms. Betty Jo Dunlap seconded the motion, and the motion carried by unanimous vote of the Board.

REVIEW BID TABULATION AND CONSIDER AND TAKE ACTION TO RECOMMEND AWARD OF CONTRACT FOR THE SOLAR PANEL PROJECT FOR THE WATER AND WASTEWATER TREATMENT PLANTS TO THE LOWEST, MOST RESPONSIBLE BIDDER

Mr. Philip explained that the City advertised for bids for the Solar Panel Project for the Water Treatment Plant and the Wastewater Treatment Plant. The City asked for a base bid for 135 KW system and a base bid for a 230 KW system. The City has a deadline of August 31, 2012 to complete the installation of the systems. Mr. Philip said the funds for this program originated from the Department of Energy and managed by the State Energy Conservation Office (SECO). The bids were as follows:

The lowest total amount was from Meridian Solar, Inc., 4109 Todd Lane, Suite 900, Austin, TX 78744, (512) 448-0055, in the amount of \$949,645.46 for the 135 KW system and \$1,479,696.44 for the 230 KW system.

Board Chairman Mr. Adolfo Lopez inquired about the difference in unit price amounts on the bid for the 135 KW Photovoltaic Array (\$3,118.48 for Wastewater and \$3,147.80 for Water) and the 230 KW Photovoltaic Array (\$2,931.94 for Wastewater and \$2,971.13 for Water). City Manager Sunny K. Philip explained that the difference is due to the fact that the solar panels for the Water Treatment Plant will be located on the north side of Dodd Lane; and therefore, the work will require that they run a line across the road from the water plant to the solar panels and the increase in unit price is to cover that expense.

Mr. Philip said that the amount available for construction for each plant is \$977,800.00. He explained that in order to maximize the funds, the City has the option of ordering two 135 KW systems for the Water Treatment Plant and two 135 KW systems for the Water Treatment Plant. If that is approved, the two 135 KW systems for the Water Treatment Plant would be a total of \$953,772.34 and the two 135 KW systems for the

Wastewater Treatment Plant would be a total of \$945,518.58, which still leaves some amount left over in the overall funds which can be changed order to maximize the grant funds. Mr. Philip said that if this option is approved by the City Commission the Water Treatment Plant would have a system which would provide about 100% of the power needs for the plant with about \$1,000.00 left over to sell and the Wastewater Treatment Plant would have a system which would provide about 60% of the power need at the plant.

Mr. Philip said his recommendation is that the Board recommend to the City Commission that the award be made to Meridian Solar, Inc., Austin, TX. and to authorize that the City go with 2-135 KW for a total of 270 KW and to increase that to 285.60 KW, on one centralized inverter, to use up all the money for the Water Treatment Plant, and to authorize that the City go with 2-135 KW for a total of 270 KW and to increase that to 289.17 KW, on one centralized inverter, to use up all the money for the Wastewater Treatment Plant.

City Attorney Mr. Richard S. Talbert read the recommended motion for the Board to consider on this item. Mr. Ralph Muse moved to recommend to the City Commission to enter into a contract with Meridian Solar, Inc. for \$953,772.34 for installation of two 135 KW photovoltaic arrays complete in place at the Water Treatment Plant including Alternate I in the bid in the proposals using a centralized inverter system and including authority to enter into all change orders deemed to be in the best interest of the City in accordance with applicable law provided, however, any such change order shall not obligate the Utilities Board and/or the City to expend funds on the project in excess of the \$217,800.00 previously approved by the Utilities Board and the City and to authorize the City Manager to execute all documents and make all disbursements relating thereto. Mr. Ovidio Saldivar seconded the motion, and the motion carried by unanimous vote of the Board.

Next, Mr. Ralph Muse moved to recommend to the City Commission to enter into a contract with Meridian Solar, Inc. for \$945,518.58 for installation of two 135 KW photovoltaic arrays complete in place at the Wastewater Treatment Plant including Alternate I in the bid in the proposals using a centralized inverter system and including authority to enter into all change orders deemed to be in the best interest of the City in accordance with applicable law provided, however, any such change order shall not obligate the Utilities Board and/or the City to expend funds on the project in excess of the \$217,800.00 previously approved by the Utilities Board and the City and to authorize the City Manager to execute all documents and make all disbursements relating thereto. Mr. Ovidio Saldivar seconded the motion, and the motion carried by unanimous vote of the Board.
