DISCUSS AND REVIEW PARK ELEMENTS PROPOSED FOR NORTHWEST PARK

Design of Northwest Park is currently underway. Benito Lozano of Megamorphosis Architects was in attendance at the meeting and reviewed elements of the proposed Northwest Park with the Commission. The discussion included raising a berm out of concern for skateboarders, although the element is not intended for such activity; using native landscaping to attract birds; and fencing material and height. The design as discussed does not include irrigation. Options for alternate fencing material were discussed as well as the possibility of using bollards and raised curbs to protect against vehicular traffic. The consensus was that bollards will not deter young children from running into the street. Concerns were raised about the proximity of the park to nearby bars and the potential for accidents, and sufficiency of lighting from current floodlights in place. It is important to have signs posted stating the rules and restrictions for park use. The signs are also an important element pending at Unger Park. The posted signs should also indicate the hours for park use by the public. The details regarding park hours in the Code of Ordinances will be referenced to prepare appropriate signs. BBQ pits should not be included to reduce debris/pollution. The wood and wire fence looks cheap, so alternate fencing material should be considered. It is important to consider maintenance and graffiti when deciding on fencing material. If wood fencing is used and later vandalized with graffiti, the City will be ready to paint over the graffiti to maintain the park. The concrete slab will have a canopy over the area. Information regarding park elements, budget, and a rendering were projected during the meeting to facilitate discussion.

Megamorphosis will incorporate suggestions made during the discussion into a revised rendering and will return to a subsequent meeting to present the revisions.

PRESENTATION AND DISCUSSION ON THE CITY OF LA FERIA COMPREHENSIVE MASTER PLAN AND THE STRATEGIC PLAN

A comprehensive plan is currently under development. Chris Stewart was present to review various elements of the plan using a PowerPoint presentation. A handout of the presentation was provided to the Commission. Mr. Stewart reviewed the baseline analysis and future land use. The demographics analysis shows a slow and steady population growth for now and indicates that regional growth is "at the doorstep." The existing housing supply meets current population needs, indicating that current strategies are working. Economic analysis shows that La Feria needs more jobs, reflects logistics and healthcare related jobs, and will benefit from additional retail options. The key to attracting retail opportunities is reaching a population of 30,000 within a three mile radius. Mr. Stewart indicated that the City is moving forward, however regional growth has not yet caught up to us. He further indicated that retailers are studying the traffic corridor and discussed the importance of protecting the areas along the expressway. We also need to increase rooftops to meet the retail numbers necessary for economic growth.

Further discussion of residential growth included single family dwellings situated too close to the expressway, in some cases compromising future growth. The location of multi-family options were observed to be well placed throughout the Community indicating good planning decisions made in the past. Overall the Community's residential state is good and the rules in place are working. Future growth is impacted by the proximity of RV parks to the expressway and connectivity between neighborhoods is also key. The older part of the City includes small lots and older structures with character. There is potential in the older neighborhoods to repurpose some of the structures to increase businesses in the northeast part of the City.

A review of the current land use plan shows the distinctions between commercial services and retail. The area on FM 2556 has naturally grown to house the logistics industry. This trend should be continued in that area. There are vacant lands along the railroad that may allow for changes including redevelopment. The location of the schools and city facilities are centrally located and accessible to the population. Parks and recreation areas are well developed and offer a diversity of uses. There is room to develop park areas to the north side of the City.

The implementation of land use plans is accomplished through the zoning regulations to protect land, regulate subdivisions, and guide capital projects throughout the City. Mr. Stewart reviewed the proposed targeted land use addressing future needs including the logistics/transporation industry, major anchor retail, healthcare, and a downtown district. Ideas from the Commission included redevelopment of areas on the north side including business sites and parks, connector streets, and replacing canals with underground pipes. The survey will include approximately 15 questions, be specific to the community, and it will be available in English and Spanish. It will be deployed online using Surveymonkey, but paper copies will also be available. Commissioner Lozano volunteered to assist with soliciting responses to the survey by going door to door in the Community. The survey is being finalized.

Following the presentation, Mr. Philip discussed the importance of this plan in making future decisions, reserving locations for future growth by buying land and implementing changes to zoning. A future meeting of all the City Boards will be planned to present more information as it is developed. The Commission was invited to provide their suggestions for plan development. The next step includes soliciting feedback from the community through an online survey, finalizing the future land use map and other component chapters to have a draft plan submitted to the City by June 30.

The TML Region 12 Training Workshop will take place on South Padre Island May 12-13. Linebarger has extended an invitation to dinner on Thursday night.
