4. PUBLIC COMMENTS

There were no comments from the public.

Commissioner Lozano made a motion to go to item 8. The motion was seconded by Commissioner Zuniga and passed unanimously.

8. <u>CONSIDERATION AND POSSIBLE ACTION TO DECLARE SURPLUS PERSONAL PROPERTY ITEMS AND AUTHORIZE DISPOSAL.</u>

Chief Phinney requested that the Commission approve the disposal of the surplus items so that they could be donated to a fire department in Mexico. Commissioner Lozano made a motion to declare surplus personal property items and authorize disposal. The motion was seconded by Mayor Pro-Tem Guevara and passed unanimously.

5. CONSENT AGENDA:

A. APPROVAL OF MINUTES FOR CITY COMMISSION MEETING HELD JUNE 14, 2022.

Mayor Pro-Tem Guevara made a motion to approve the items under consent agenda as presented. The motion was seconded by Commissioner Lozano and passed unanimously.

6. PUBLIC HEARING TO CONSIDER A REQUEST TO ANNEX 25.24 ACRES OF LAND OUT OF BLOCKS 21, 28 AND 49 SOLIS SUBDIVISION, CAMERON COUNTY, TEXAS

Mayor Maldonado opened the public hearing at 6:51 pm. Mr. Ortiz explained that the property would have access to all City services. The subdivision will contain around eighty lots for single-family homes. The public hearing was closed at 6:54 pm.

CONSIDERATION AND POSSIBLE ACTION ON AN ORDINANCE TO ANNEX 25.24 ACRES OF LAND OUT OF BLOCKS 21, 28 AND 49 SOLIS SUBDIVISION, CAMERON COUNTY, TEXAS

Mayor Pro-Tem Guevara made a motion to approve Ordinance 2022-05 to annex 25.24 acres of land out of blocks 21, 28 and 49 Solis Subdivision, Cameron County, Texas. The motion was seconded by Commissioner Lozano and passed unanimously.

9. <u>DISCUSSION AND POSSIBLE ACTION REGARDING ORDINANCE 2022-06 ALLOWING ALCOHOL CONSUMPTION AT VETERAN'S MEMORIAL PARK/SPORTS COMPLEX ON JULY 2, 2022.</u>

Commissioner Lozano made a motion to approve Ordinance 2022-06 allowing alcohol consumption at Veteran's Memorial Park/Sports Complex. The motion was seconded by Commissioner Zuniga and passed unanimously.

10. <u>CONSIDERATION AND POSSIBLE ACTION TO ADJUST A PROFESSIONAL SERVICES CONTRACT</u> WITH R. GUTIERREZ ENGINEERING FOR THE STREET IMPROVEMENTS PROJECT.

Mr. Sandoval explained that the original contract was approved before the list of streets for this project was expanded. Commissioner Lozano made a motion to approve the adjustment to a professional services contract with R. Gutierrez Engineering for the street improvements project. The motion was seconded by Commissioner Zuniga and passed unanimously.

11. CONSIDERATION AND POSSIBLE ACTION TO AUTHORIZE THE INTERVENTION OF THE LLOYD GOSSELINK ROCHELLE & TOWNSEND, P.C. LAW FIRM IN THE RECENT AEP 2023 ENERGY EFFICIENCY COST RECOVERY FACTOR ("EECRF") APPLICATION.

Mayor Pro-Tem Guevara made a motion to authorize the intervention of the Lloyd, Gosselink Rochelle & Townsend, P.C. Law Firm in The Recent AEP 2023 Energy Efficiency Cost Recovery Factor ("EECRF") Application. The motion was seconded by Commissioner Zuniga and passed unanimously.

12. <u>INFRAMARK MONTHLY REPORT REGARDING WATER AND WASTEWATER FACILITY</u> OPERATIONS AND MAINTENANCE.

George Quilantan updated the Commission on the repairs and improvements being made at the water and wastewater treatment plants and lift stations. There was no action taken on this item.
