At 6:30 P.M., Board President Ms. Laurie Villarreal led everyone present in reciting the Pledge of Allegiance to the Flag of the United States of America. She then declared that a quorum of the LFIDC Board was present and called the meeting to order.

3. PUBLIC COMMENTS

There were no comments from the public.

4. CONSIDERATION AND POSSIBLE ACTION ON MINUTES OF THE REGULAR MEETING OF THE LA FERIA INDUSTRIAL DEVELOPMENT CORPORATION (LFIDC) HELD ON THURSDAY, MAY 2, 2019.

Mr. Gonzales made a mot ion to approve the minutes for the Meeting held May 2, 2019 as presented. The motion was seconded by Mr. Becerra and passed unanimously.

5. <u>PRESENTATION AND DISCUSSION REGARDING GRANT APPLICATION FOR TEARDOWN</u> OF DILAPIDATED PROPERTIES.

Mr. Sandoval explained that the LFIDC applied for grant funding to demolish dilapidated buildings in the City's downtown area. Unfortunately, the grant application was unsuccessful. The only other option would be for the LFIDC to fund the destruction directly. The estimated cost to demolish one property and convert it to public parking is \$40,000. There was no action taken on this item.

6. PRESENTATION AND DISCUSSION REGARDING OUTSTANDING LOANS CURRENTLY HELD BY THE LFIDC.

Mr. Rios reviewed all outstanding loans issued by the LFIDC to certain non-profit organizations as well as loans issued to the LFIDC. He stated that there was some confusion about the total amount due for one outstanding loan due to lack of proper record keeping. He is working with the recipient of that loan to clear up the issue. There was no action taken on this item.
